Hai Lang Eyecare Mission

Another successful eyecare outreach mission was conducted in the first quarter of 2024. 17 grassroots medical workers were trained and gifted with basic eyecare equipment to serve at their Commune Health Centers. Meanwhile, over 11,000 middle school students were screened and examined. At the end of the mission, 246 pairs of glasses were gifted to the children prescribed to wear them. This is the first project that CDF partnered with the Ohio-based D.O.V.E Fund.
